Manhard Consulting understands USEPA 319(h) grant requirements and has assisted multiple Georgia municipalities in obtaining project funding for several projects as well as implementing and administering these grant projects.



In 2007, Manhard assisted the City of Covington in preparation of a 319(h) grant application that resulted in an award of \$158,000 award for design and construction of stormwater wetlands along Dried Indian Creek. Manhard is currently providing design services for this project and is assisting the City with management and reporting for this ongoing grant-funded project.

In 2006 – 2007, Manhard assisted Gwinnett County with the implementation of a 319(h) funded project: Storm Water BMP Demonstration - Implementation of the Storm Water Master Plan for the Crooked Creek Watershed within Gwinnett County. For this project Manhard completed a watershed improvement study for the County that resulted in the design and

construction of two pond restoration projects adjacent to Crooked Creek. Manhard is also assisting the County with management and reporting for this ongoing grant project.

In 2006, Manhard assisted the City of Pine Lake in preparation of a 319(h) grant application that resulted in an award of over \$200,000 in USEPA 319(h) Grant funds for implementation of a habitat enhancement project along Snapfinger Creek. Manhard was also awarded the design of this project, which includes over 3 acres of constructed wetlands. Manhard is currently assisting the City with management and reporting for this ongoing grant-funded project.

In 2004, Manhard assisted the City of Covington in preparation of grant applications that ultimately resulted in an award of over \$300,000 in USEPA 319(h) Grant money for three projects. Using this money, the City of Covington implemented a Storm Sewer Mapping Program to fulfill the storm sewer system mapping requirement defined in the Illicit Discharge Detection and Elimination section of the City's Phase II permit (for this grant cycle a one time NPDES program implementation funding request was allowed); an Erosion and Sediment Control Inspection Program; and a BMP Demonstration Project which will serve to reduce the concentration of oil, grease, phosphorus, and heavy sediments, which are the prevailing pollutants on the site. Manhard is currently assisting the City with implementation and management of these grant projects.

Also in 2004, Manhard also assisted the City of Canton in preparation of grant applications that ultimately resulted in an award of approximately \$100,000 in USEPA 319(h) Grant money for two projects. Using these funds, the City of Canton, also implemented their Erosion and Sediment Control Inspections Program and implemented a BMP Demonstration Project to reduce existing non-point source pollution to comply with NPDES Phase II post-construction stormwater runoff control.
