The Volo Millennium Trail is an urban trail constructed by the Village of Volo and dedicated to the Lake County Forest Preserve District as part of their extensive overall trail network. The two portions of the Volo Millennium Trail completed by Manhard Consulting total approximately 5600 lineal feet. A portion of this trail was completed on the Village of Volo Municipal Site and the remaining portion of the trail is located in an easement along the west side of Fish Lake Road.

The trail sections are made up of a 12 foot wide paved asphalt section with adjacent ditches and culvert crossings for drainage.

Manhard's responsibilities for the trail design included stormwater calculations for floodplain fill and compensatory storage areas, interim trail crossings and signage of state and local highways, wetland impacts and preservation, and preparation of bid documents and contracts for public bidding of the trail construction.

Numerous agencies were also involved with the completion of this trail system. Manhard Consulting was in charge of all coordination with Lake County Stormwater Management Commission, Village of Volo, Lake County Forest Preserve, Illinois Department of Transportation and the Army Corps of Engineers. Construction on portions of the trail are still ongoing with Manhard Consulting continuing to provide service to the Village of Volo.
