Hazard Mitigation is any action taken to reduce the effects of future disasters. The primary purpose of hazard mitigation planning is to identify community policies, actions, and tools for implementation over the long term that will result in a reduction in risk to people and their property from hazards.

It's always important to plan for the worst, but the Disaster Mitigation Act of 2000 moved Hazard Mitigation Planning from a need to a requirement for any State, Indian Tribal, and local governments seeking certain types of non-emergency disaster assistance, including FEMA funding for mitigation projects.
